Method:

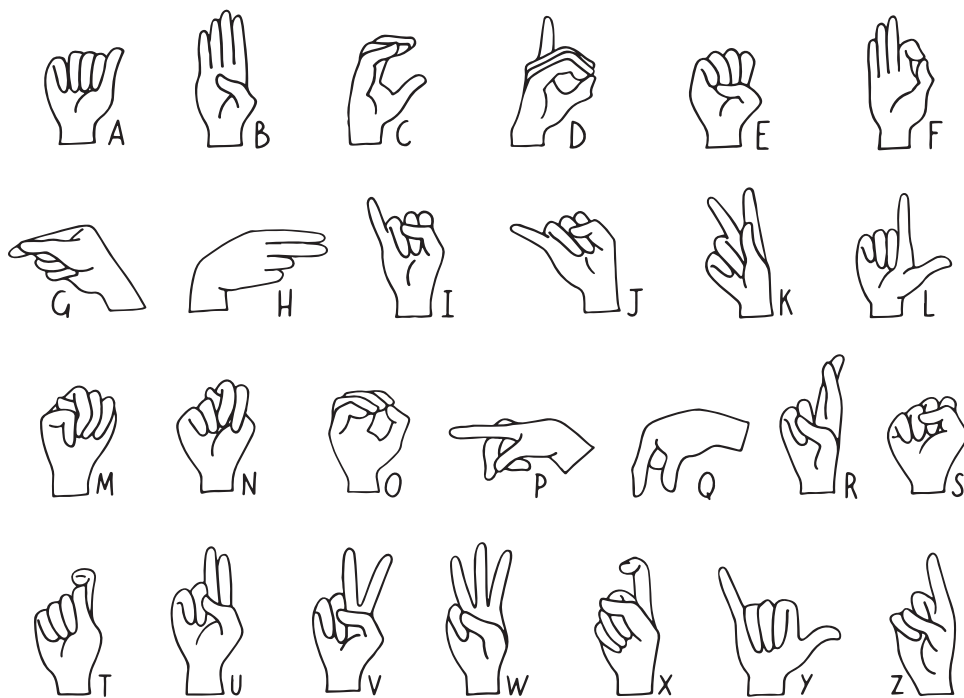
- Stretch the elastics over the box. Roll them down so that they are evenly spread.

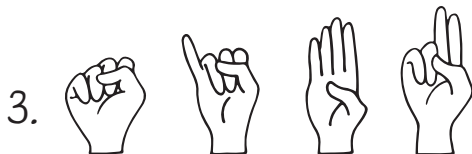

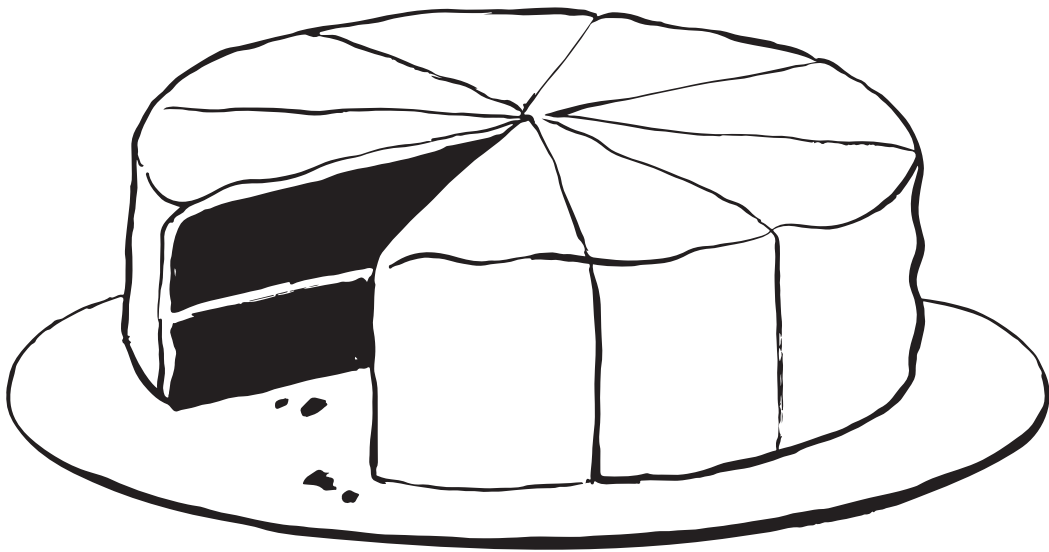






Chocolate Cake

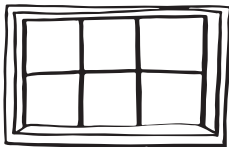
