made available to interested parties, on request. All data will reside with the researcher and her

supervisor until examination of the research is complete in November 2009, after which, the data will be

destroyed.

your decision and no explanation will be required, should you prefer not to participate. There is no

preparation involved for both learners and teachers prior to administration. There are no direct benefits

signed by the children at the time of administration, will be required for each participant. Furthermore,

participation in the study is entirely voluntary, and the parents/legal guardians' and child's decision to

participate or not participate will have no negative consequences, either academically or personally.

Participation will in no way affect or impact on any learner's academic progress. Any participant may

withdraw at any point, or decline to answer specific items of the questionnaire, with no questions asked.

In the unlikely event that any participant experiences emotional disturbance as a result of participation

in the research, an appropriate referral for free counselling will be made.
