

APPENDIX A: INTERVIEW WITH SEISA

1. How did you get a mentor in the MMUF Programme ?

I had two mentors. I got the first one after the selection interview. I was told by AB and MM that I had a mentor assigned to me. The mentor was a specialist in the field that I have chosen as a major. The second mentor was not chosen for me but I chose her. We were very close since she was in the same department that I was in. before becoming my mentor she used to invite me to church.

2. Did you and your mentor talk about expectations or goals or establish ground rules ?

With the first mentor we did not. There was no schedule. I would just go to her office and we would work on what I wanted to do at that time. But with the second mentor, we had timelines; whatever I had to work on was timed. We had set meeting dates and whenever I realize that I would not make the deadline I would call her or email her to explain that.
