Congress Militant: Revolutionary Papers as Political Organizers

Abstract

The article considers the pivotal organizing role of the revolutionary paper *Congress Militant* for the Marxist Workers' Tendency of the African National Congress from the late 1980s to the mid-1990s, a period characterized by mass popular struggles against apartheid, violence, and political negotiations. *Congress Militant* was instrumental in shaping the internal life of the Tendency, from being a space of reportage of local struggles and political analyses to contributing to the development of a community of revolutionary cadres who belonged to national and international
