

CHAPTER SIX

CONCLUSION

A regime of breathing exercises, coughing and mobilisation confers no advantage over instruction to walk alone in the uncomplicated post-operative valvular surgery patient. Chest physiotherapy has little impact on post-operative hypoxaemia, chest x-ray changes and length of post-operative stay on patients who have undergone uncomplicated elective heart valve surgery.

The age, race and sex of the participants in this study are typical of the patient population requiring cardiac valve surgery in the Johannesburg Hospital, South Africa.

There seems to be little or no correlation between temperature and atelectasis detectable on chest x-ray in this patient population.

The conclusions drawn from this study cannot be extrapolated to include patients who undergo emergency valve surgery, who have a documented respiratory history or those with an underlying neurological condition. They can also not include patients who are intubated for longer than 24 hours, have a post-operative intensive care stay of longer than 48 hours and those who develop cardiac instability or neurological problems post-operatively. However it would seem safe to conclude that routine chest physiotherapy does not have a prophylactic role to play in the post-operative cardiac patient. A more sound principle would be that each patient is assessed daily by a physiotherapist and

treated only in the presence of signs of a pulmonary complication. Signs and symptoms of a pulmonary complication would include:

- an otherwise unexplained oral temperature of more than 38.5° C
- radiological evidence of pronounced collapse or consolidation
- clinical evidence of a pulmonary infection resulting in prescription of antibiotics for a chest infection.
