

Lerwa la Vukhalaga. A large, semi-opaque blue-white bead.

Professor van Riet Lowe knows the type from the West (Luban) coast and says they also occur in Rhodesia.

Khiregana. Metal bead of copper or iron.

Khidegane. Small, cylindrical opaque blue canes usually worn by small children for protection but only rarely figuring in religious rites. (unidentified)

Khifago. Small white oblates.
