By integrating ORCID as a unique, persistent digital identifier, this initiative establishes a seamless link between Zimbabwean scholars and the global scientific community. The 2026 rollout across Zimbabwean higher education institutions aims to unify fragmented researcher data, ensuring that every contribution is accurately attributed and discoverable within the open science framework.

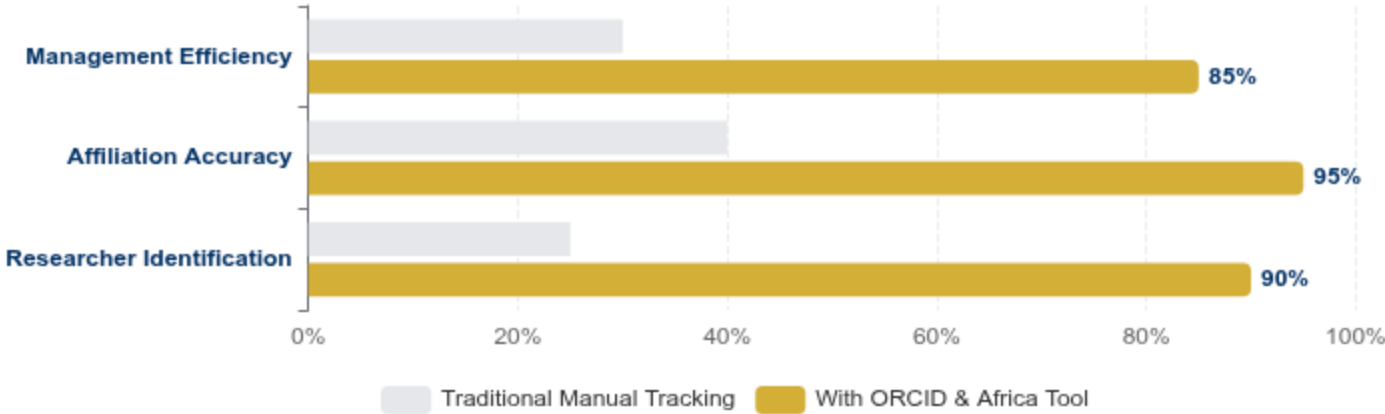

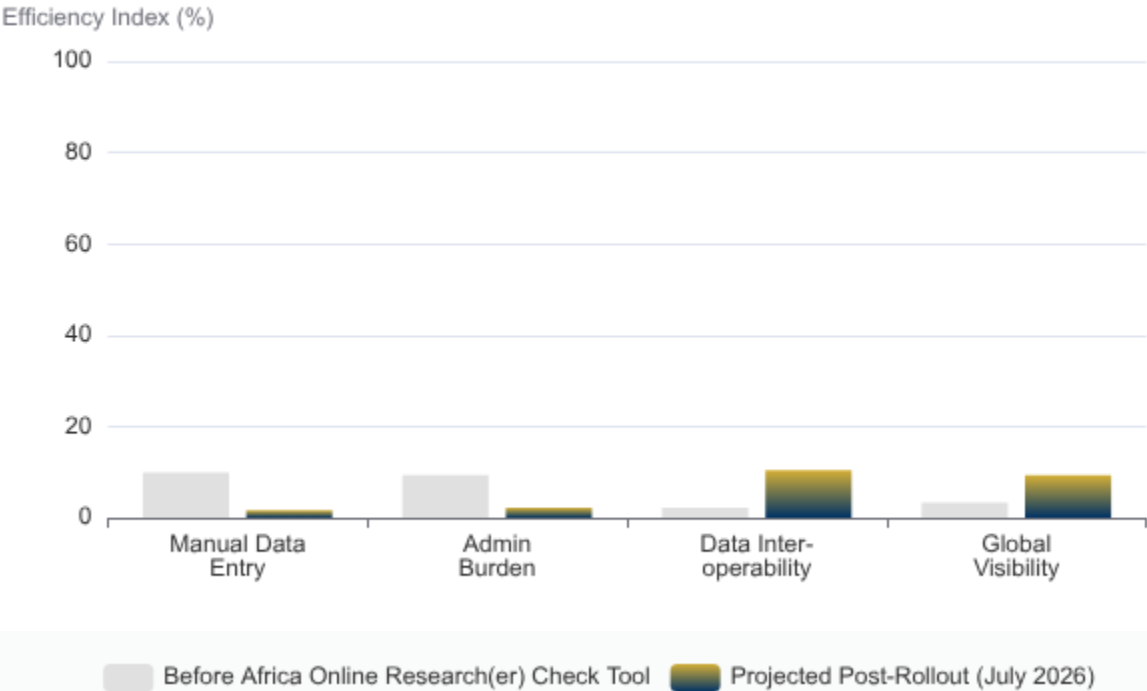
Data Insights & Framework Alignment

01 Review Scope Definition

Focusing on the intersection of ORCID adoption, Open Science policies, and institutional repositories within the African higher education landscape.

02 Search Strategy

Comprehensive queries across Web of Science, Scopus, Sabinet, and AJOL using keywords: "ORCID", "Persistent Identifiers", "Open Science Africa", and "Zimbabwean Research."

03 Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

- Included: Peer-reviewed studies (2015-2025), policy whitepapers.
- Excluded: Non-English literature, general IT studies without research focus.

04 Data Extraction Framework

Structured extraction of institutional barriers, technical integration challenges, and metadata compliance rates from selected literature.

05 Quality Assessment

Critical appraisal of evidence using the MMAT (Mixed Methods Appraisal Tool) to ensure the validity and reliability of findings for the Zimbabwean context.

06 Synthesis Approach

Narrative Synthesis:

Thematic mapping of implementation drivers to inform the rollout of the African Online Research(er) Check Tool in Zimbabwean Universities.

Framework Overview

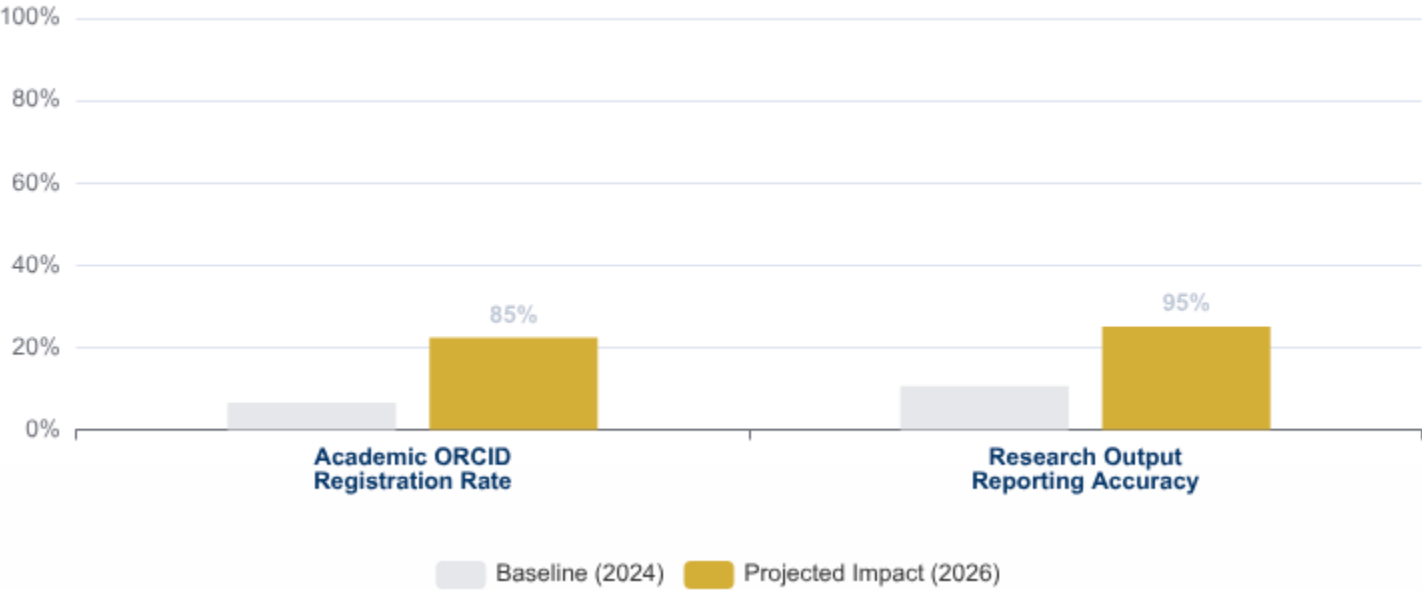

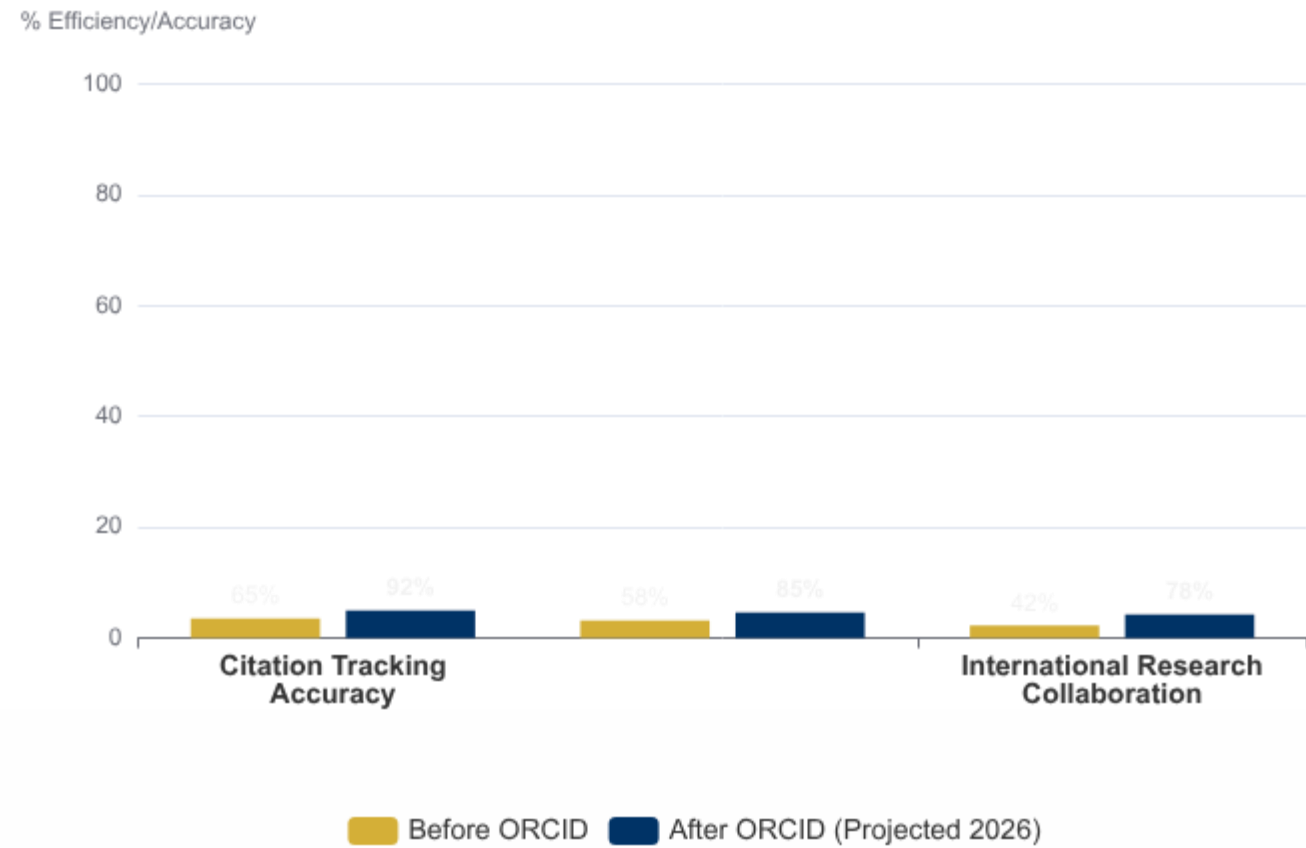

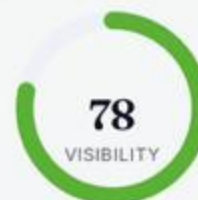
