Rwanda: assistance

*1. Mr A J LEON asked the Minister of Foreign Affairs:

Whether the Government has been requested by any (a) international organisations and/or (b) countries to render assistance aimed at resolving the crisis in Rwanda; if so, what assistance had been (i) requested and (ii) rendered in each case as at the latest specified date for which information is available?

The MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS:

- (a) (i) The Secretary-General of the United Nations has requested the South African Government to consider any possible assistance it could render with regard to the crisis in Rwanda.
 - (ii) The South African Permanent Representative at the United Nations was also requested by the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping of the United Nations that South Africa should consider the supply of 50 armoured personnel carriers for peace-keeping operations in Rwanda.
- (b) No countries have requested our assistance, but I would like to add the following.
 - (i) (a) United Nations agencies such as UNDP and UNICEF appealed to all United Nations member states to render humanitarian assistance.

- (b) The United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping requested the South African Permanent Representative at the United Nations to consider supplying 50 armoured personnel carriers (APCs) for United Nations operations in Rwanda.
- (ii) (a) After deliberations with several church organisations, the South African Government responded by deciding to supply food, blankets, medical supplies and water purification tablets.

 Logistics are at present being implemented to deliver the requested material as soon as possible.
 - (b) Negotiations between the United Nations and the South African Government with regard to the supply of the APCs are in an advanced stage.

I should add that this matter was again emphasised in our recent discussions with the Secretary-General of the United Nations. We understand that our delegation at the United Nations is constantly in discussion with those responsible for such matters at the United Nations, particularly regarding the logistics of delivering the 50 armoured personnel carriers to Rwanda.
