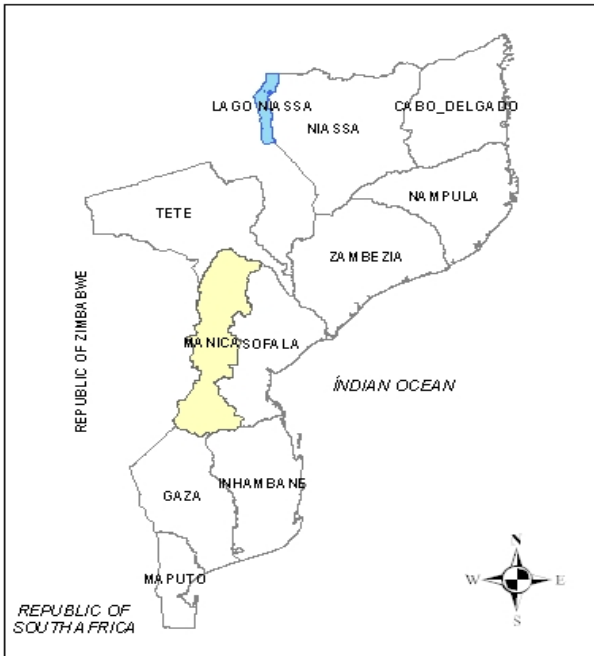

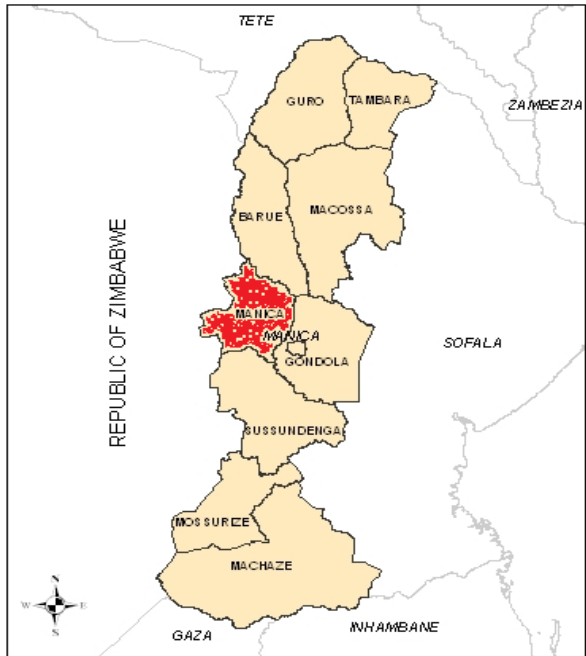

#### Map 1- Area of Study: Manica District and its Administrative Villages after 1975

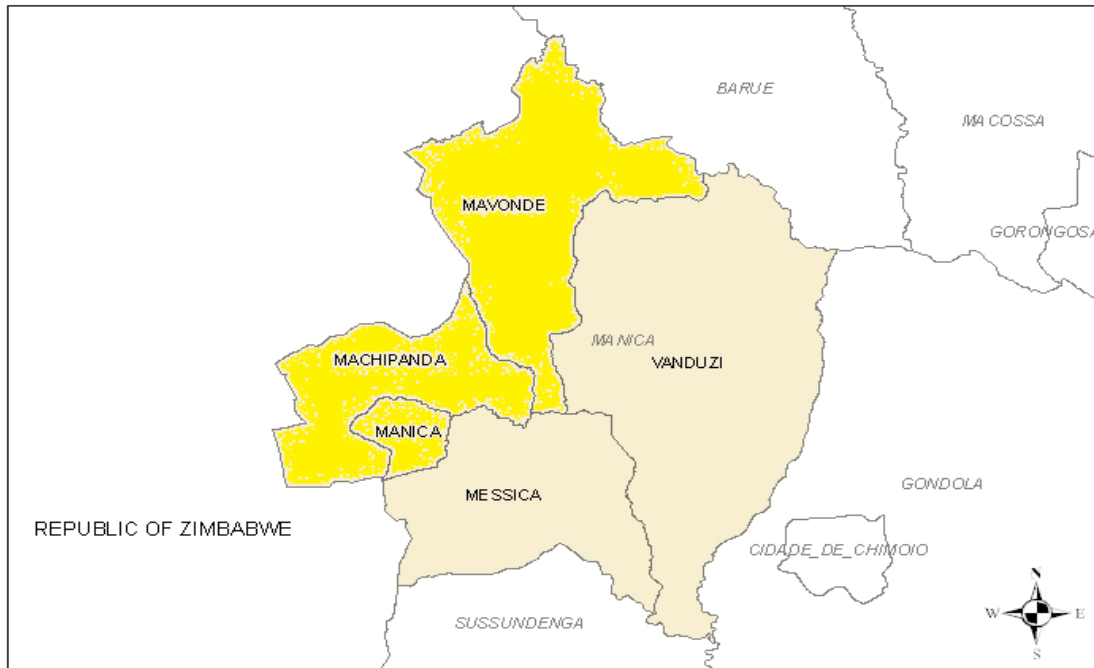
**Map.1.1- Manica Province in Republic of Mozambique**



**Map. 1.2- Manica District in Manica Province**

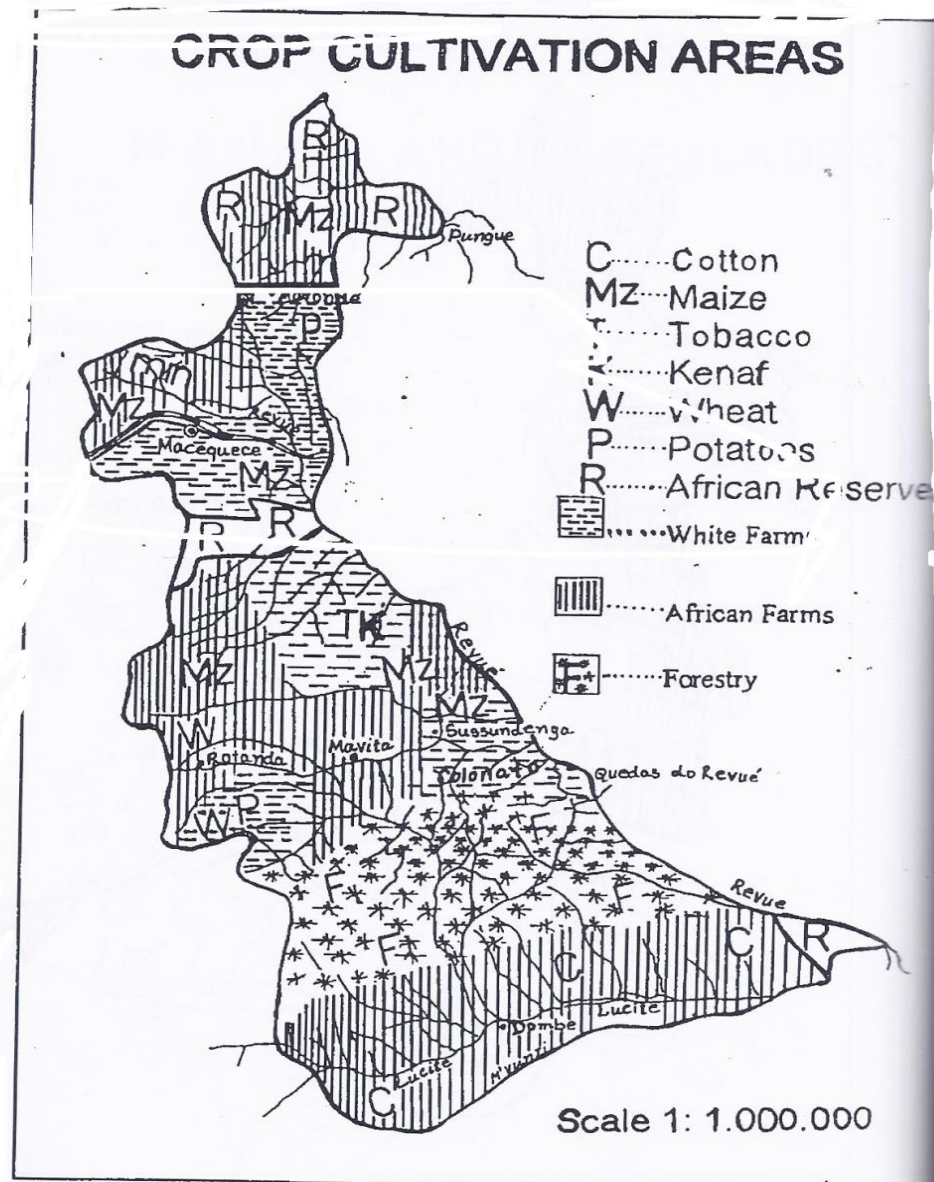


**Map. 1.3- Mavonde; Machipanda, and Manica administrative villages of Manica District-Study Area**



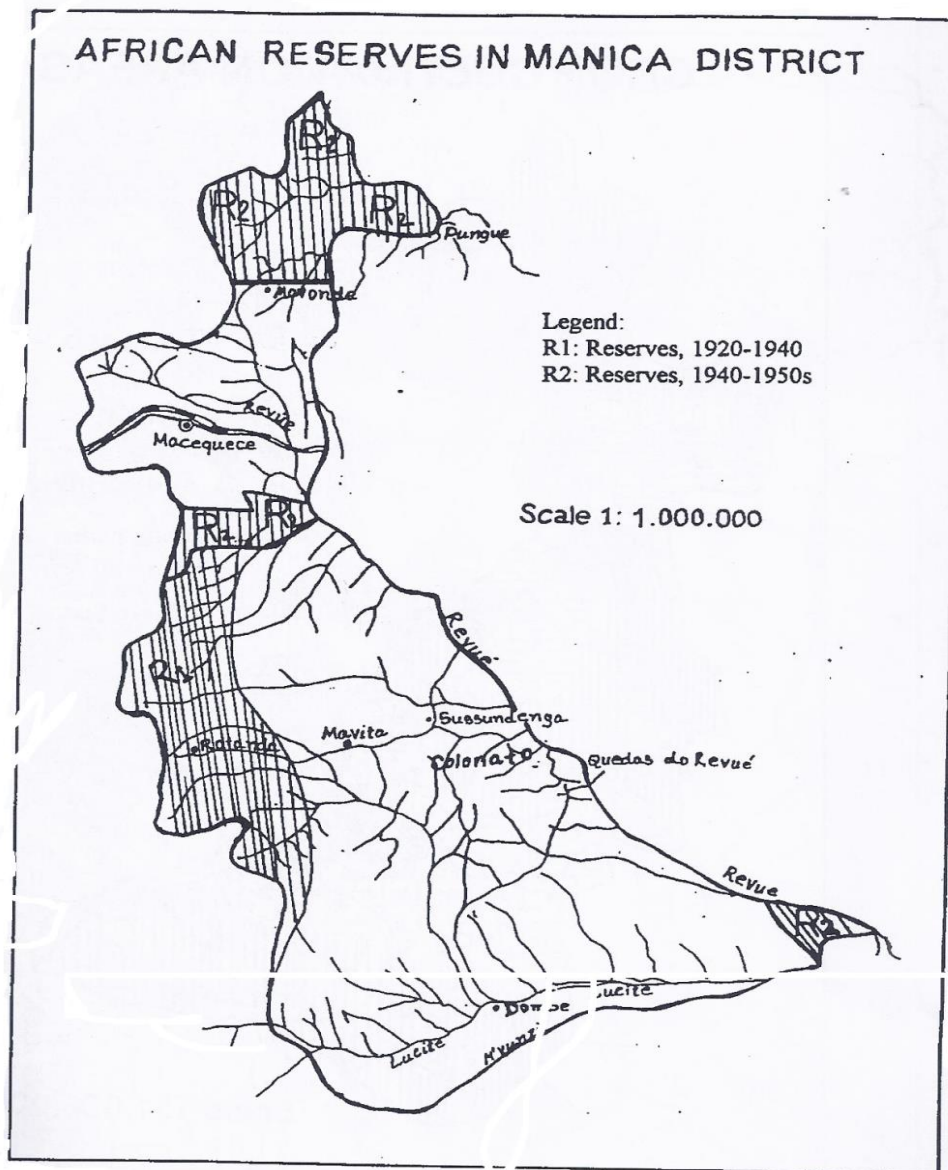

**Map 2: Crop Cultivation Areas in Manica Administrative Conselho**



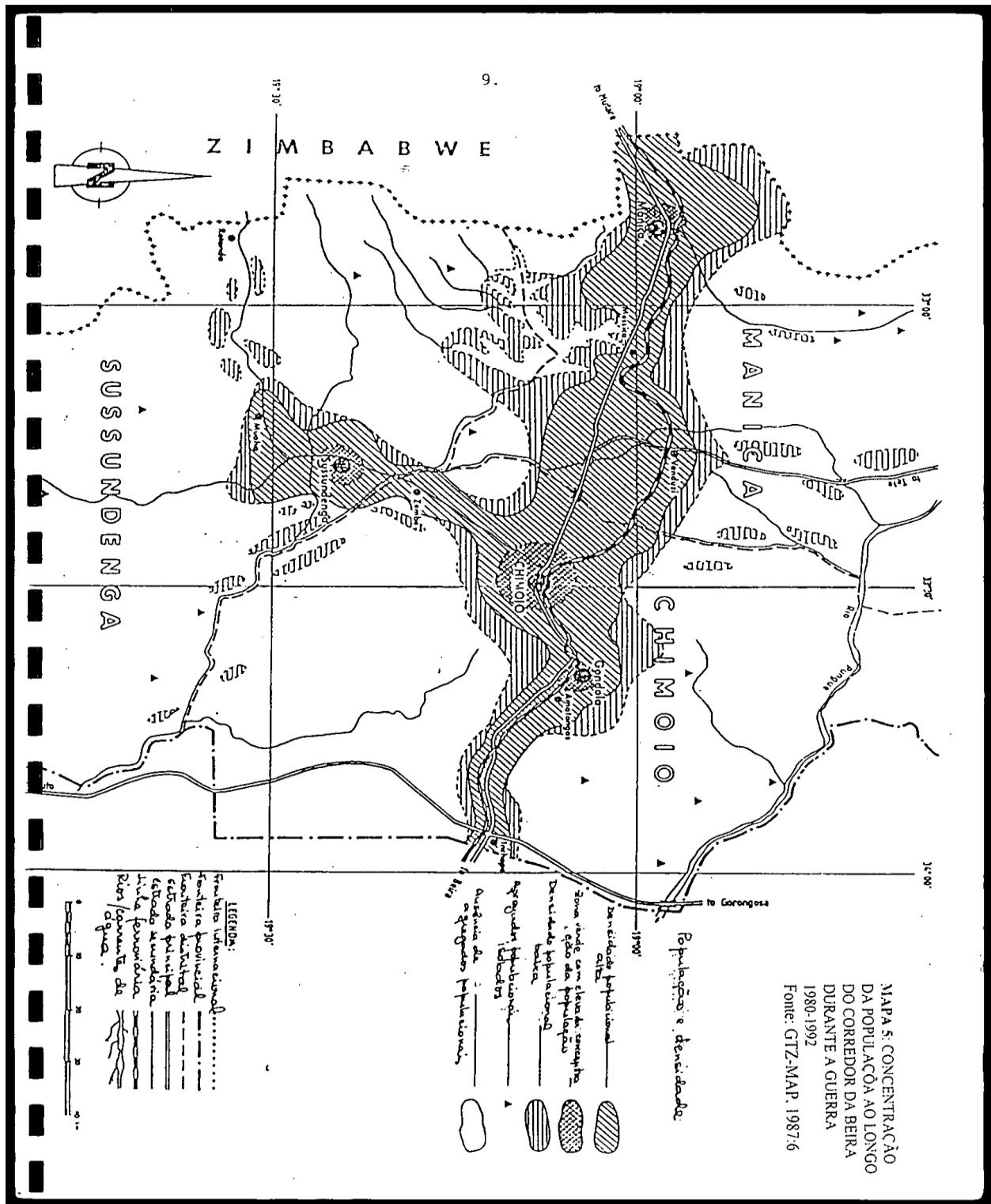

## **Appendix 2: Principal and Secondary Roads of the Manica District, 1961-1968**

Manica district had six (6) secondary roads and eight (8) principal rural roads (Estradas Rurais-ER), namely: ER N<sup>o</sup> 216 with 200 km of extension, from Villa Perry to Espungabeira, crossing Mavita and Dombe posts; ER N<sup>o</sup> 431 with 90 km from Garudzo to Dombe; ER N<sup>o</sup> 436 with 77 km from Manica town to Mavita; ER N<sup>o</sup> 437 with 10 km from Manica town to Vumba; ER N<sup>o</sup> 438 with 20 km from Manica town to Penhalonga; ER N<sup>o</sup> 439 with 66 km from Manica town and round to the mineral area of Manica; ER N<sup>o</sup> 440 with 4 km from Manica town to Penhalonga and on to Macequece Fort; and ER N<sup>o</sup> 441 with 83 km linking with ER N<sup>o</sup> 216, through Mavita to the border region with Southern Rhodesia in Rotanda.<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>1</sup>The secondary's roads in Manica *Conselho* were: Munene linking with Penhalonga; Chua linking with Inhamucarara; Zónué linking with Mavita; Chirambandine linking with Beira Corridor; Massambuzi linking with Penhalonga; and Nhahambué linking with Penhalonga, (Franklin, "Relatório da Inspeção Ordenaria ao Conselho de Manica", 120/5).
