Subjects of Instruction:—English, reading, spelling, writing, arithmetic, physical exercises, singing, elementary drawing, sewing (for girls), industrial work, such as gardening, matweaving and basket making (for boys).

Note:—The children usually pay from 6d. to 1s. per month, sometimes more, in the form of school fees. In most cases the Church building serves the purpose of the school as well, but the seats suitable for full-grown persons are undesirable for children, and Missionary Superintendents are being urged to put up separate school buildings and to equip them with suitable furniture.











Sub-Tropical areas include Bechuanaland, Portuguese Territory South of Latitude 22 degrees.


Temperate areas include Basutoland, Cape Colony, Swaziland, Northern Transvaal, Transvaal, Orange River Colony.
