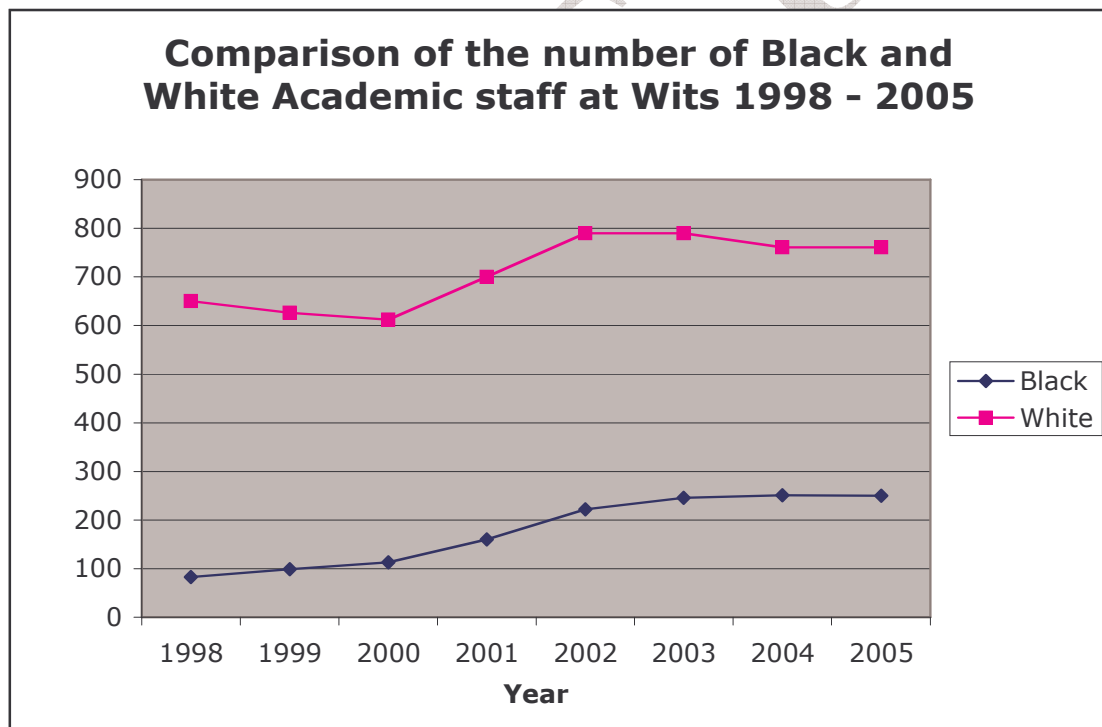

**Graph 1: Comparison of white and black academics at Wits**



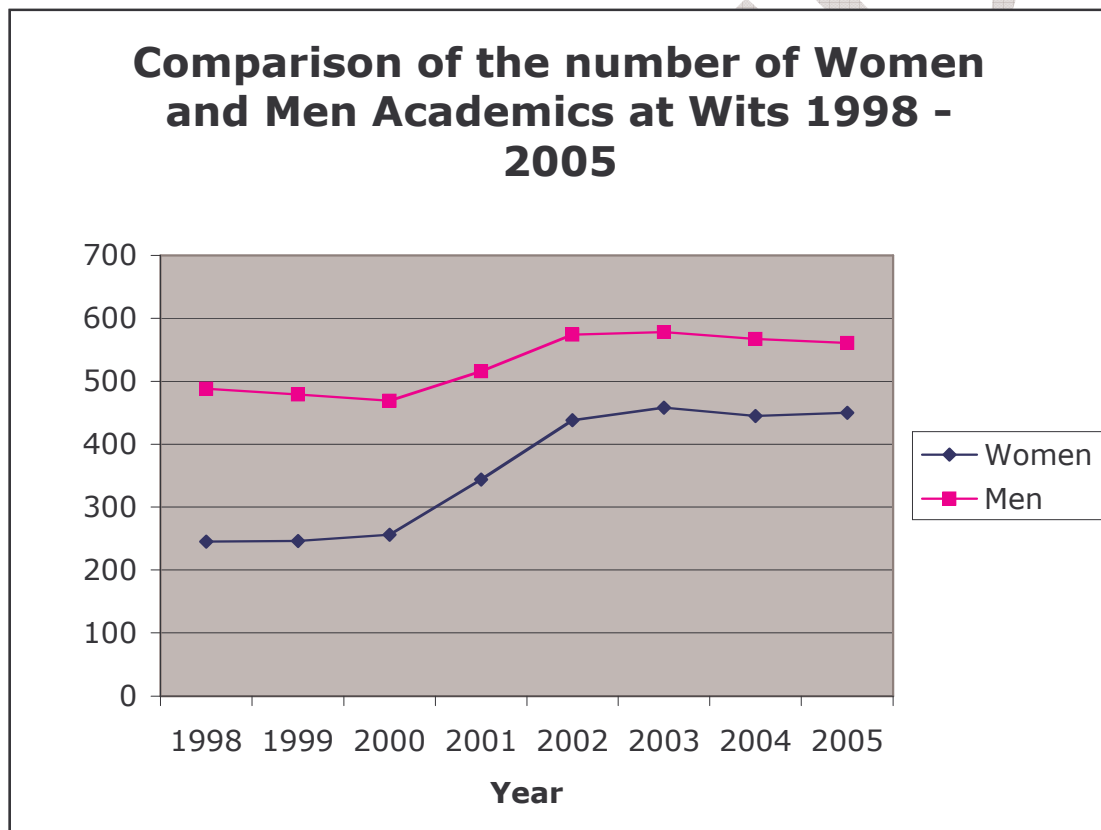

**Graph 2: Comparison of Wits' academics by gender**



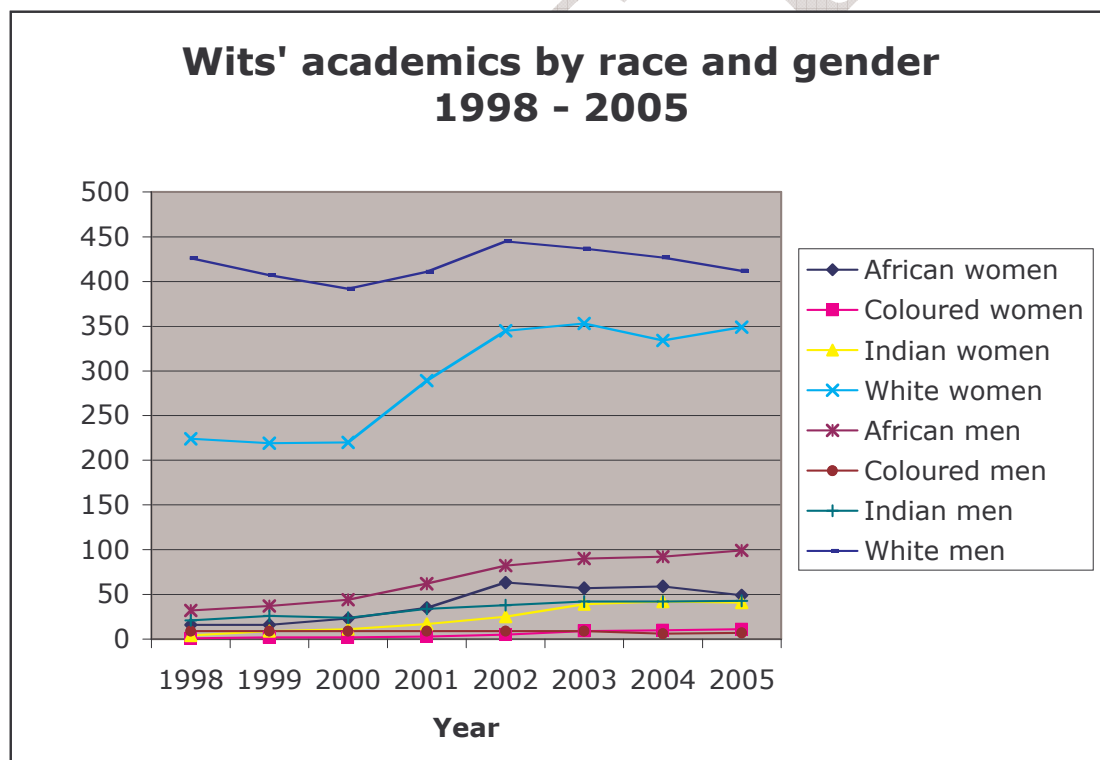

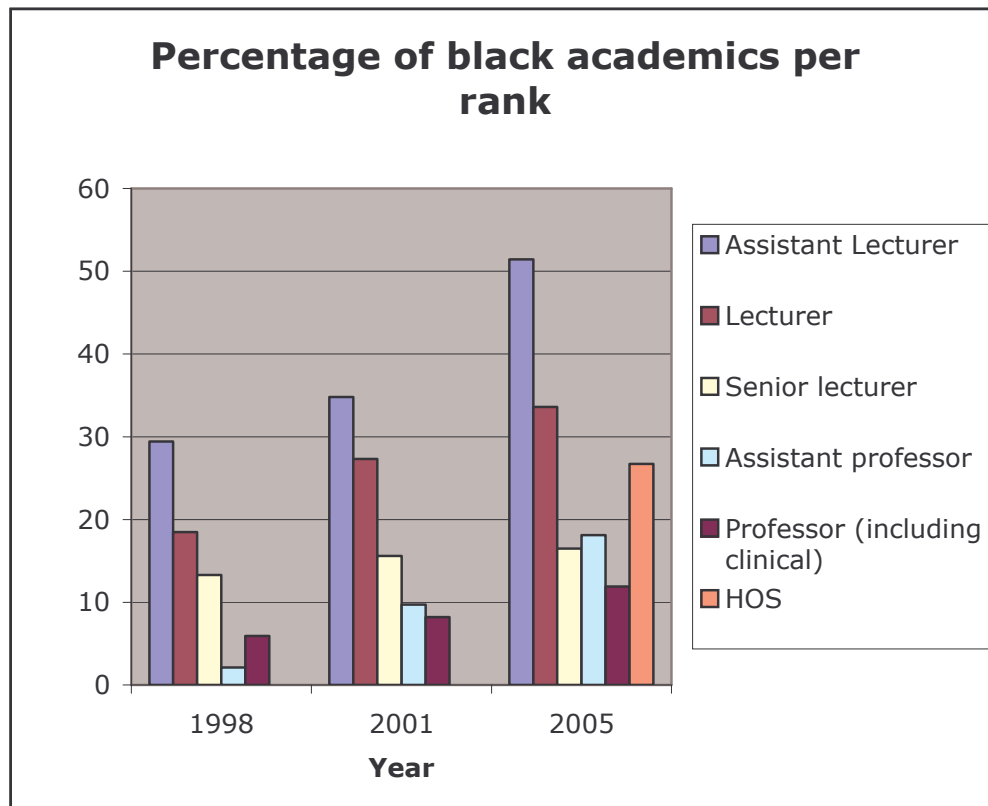

**Graph 4: Comparison of black academics at Wits per rank in 1998, 2001 & 2005**



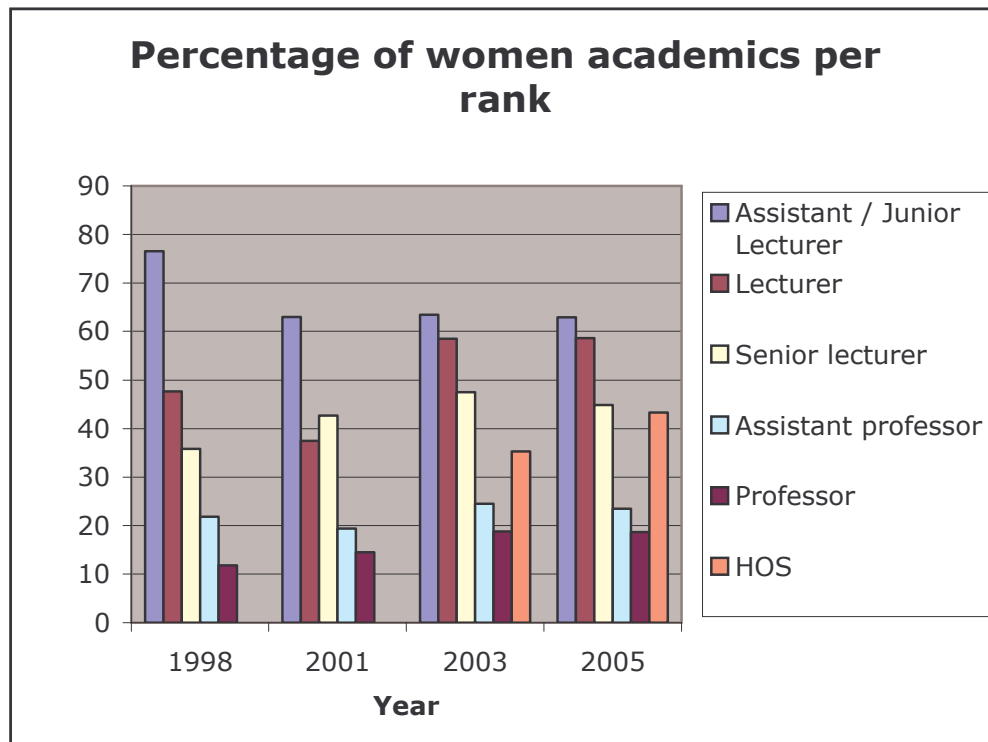

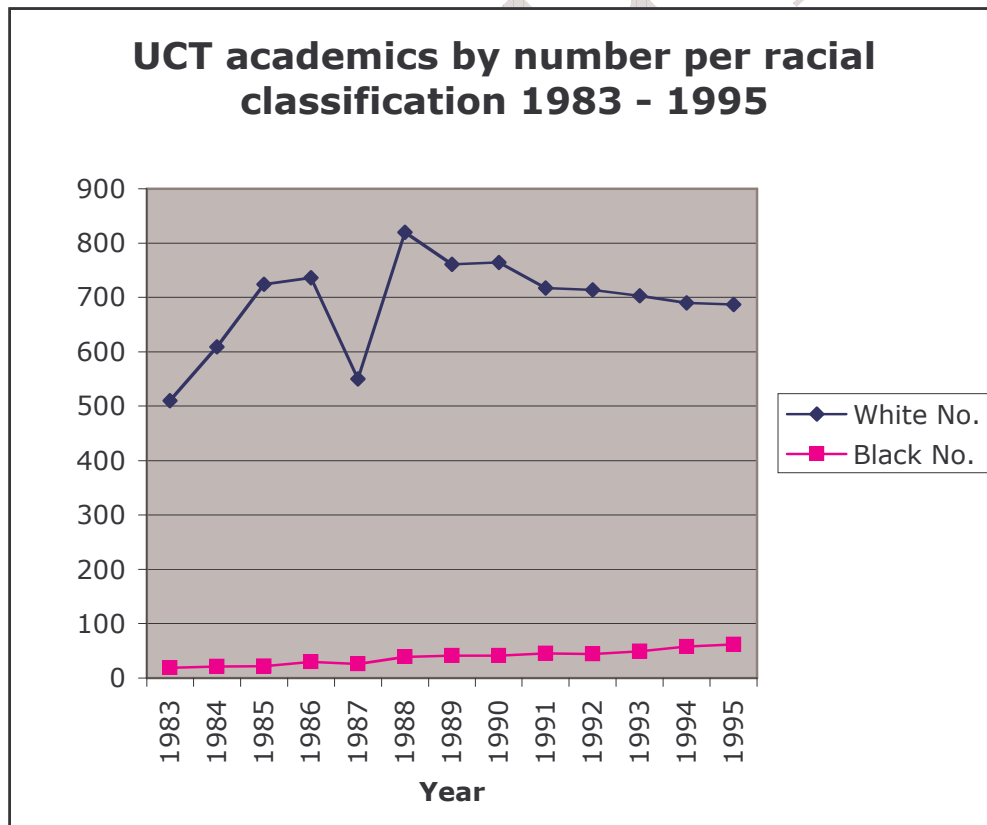

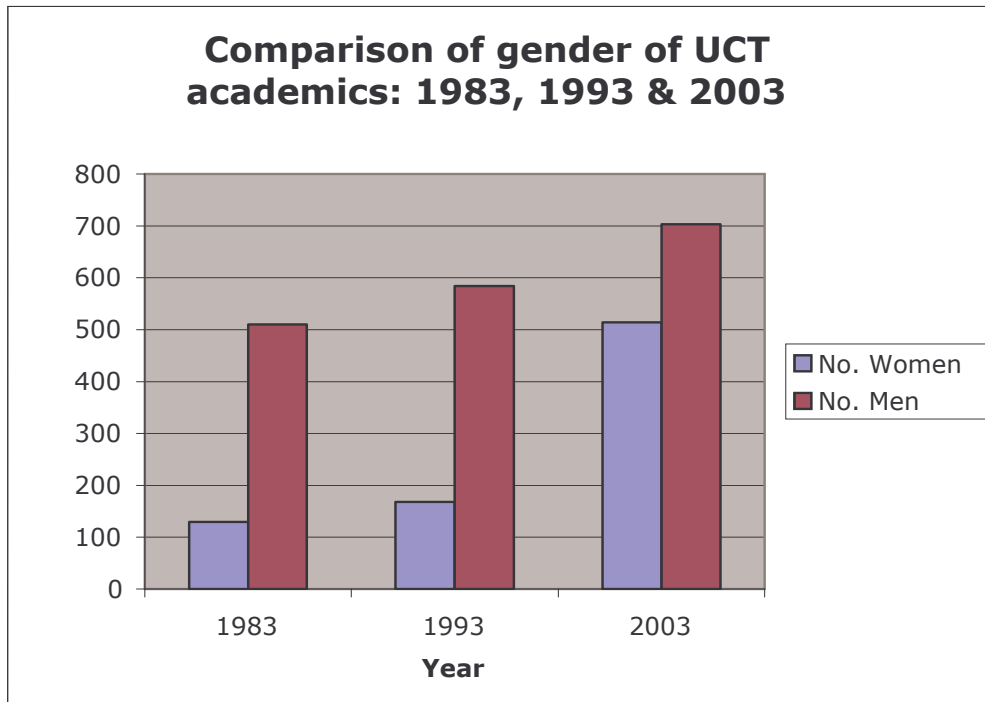

**Graph 1: Comparison of white and black academics at UCT**



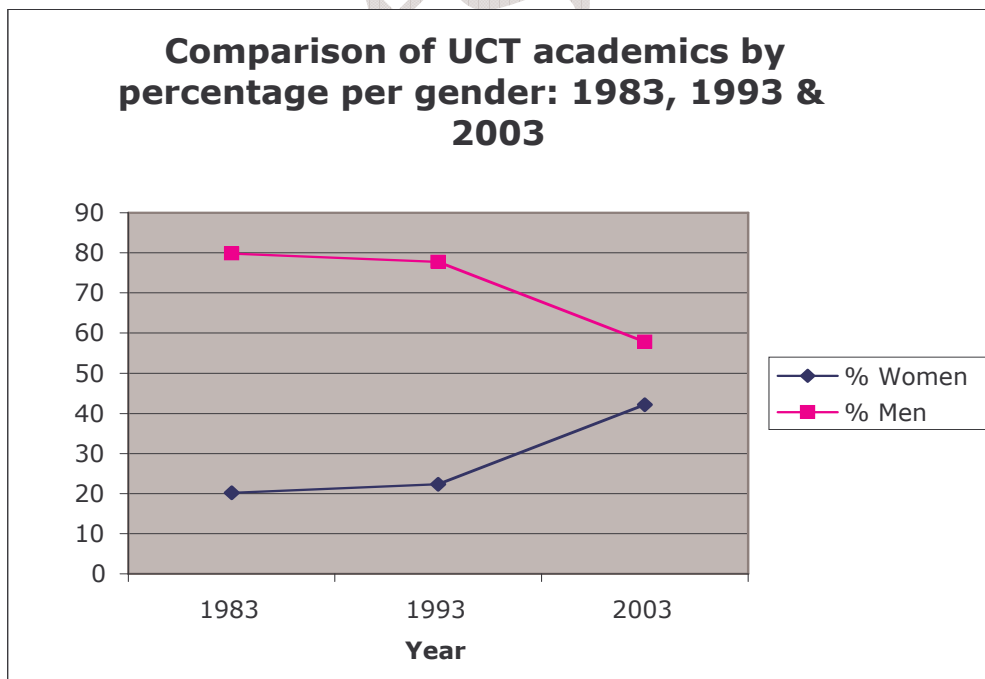

**Graph 3: Comparison of gender proportions in 1983, 1993 & 2003**



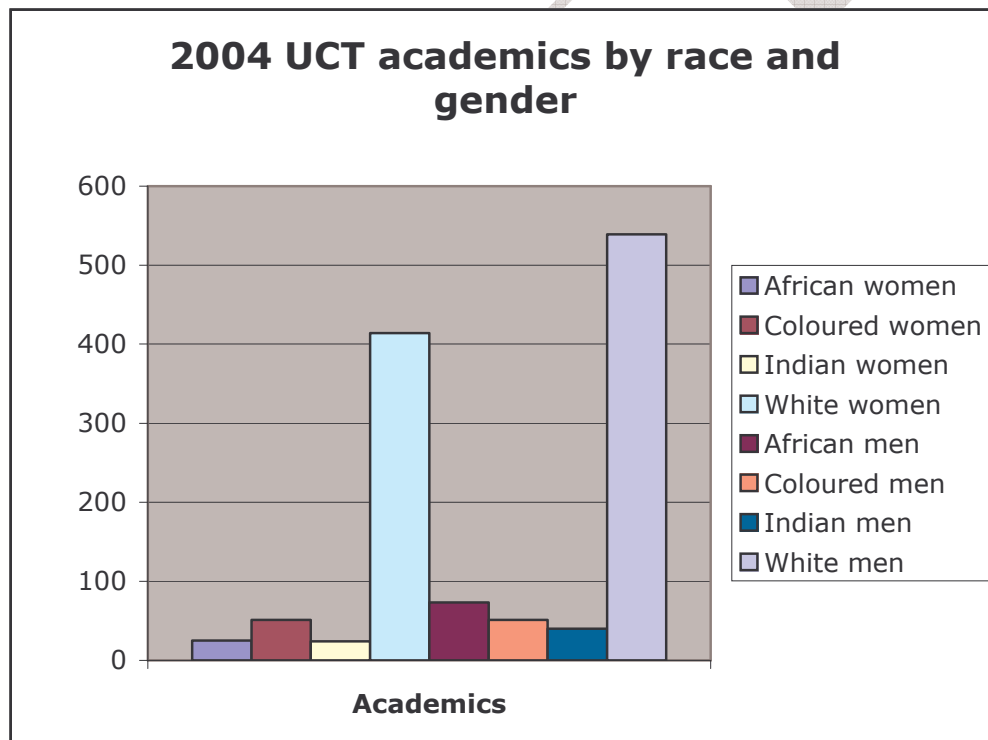

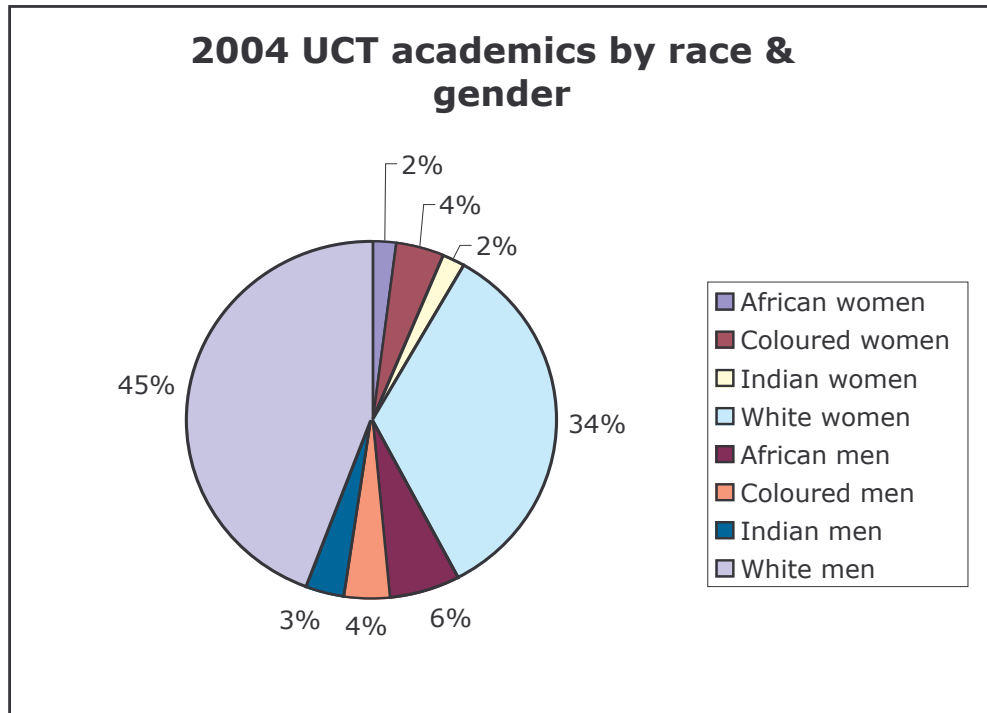
**Graph 4: Graphical representation of UCT academics by race and gender in 2004**

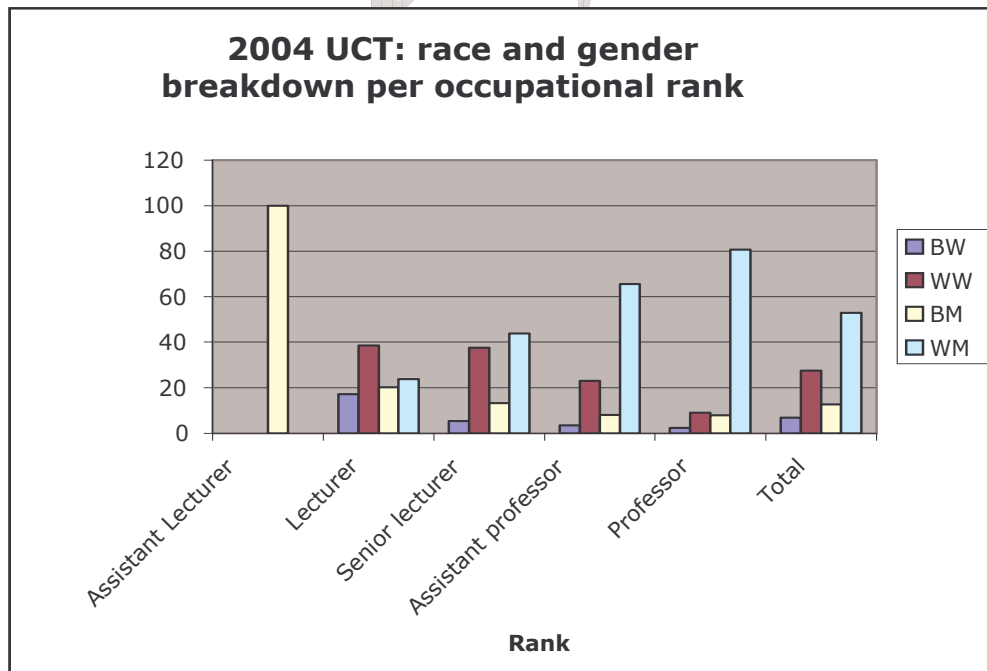


**Graph 5: Proportional representation of UCT academics by race and gender in 2004**



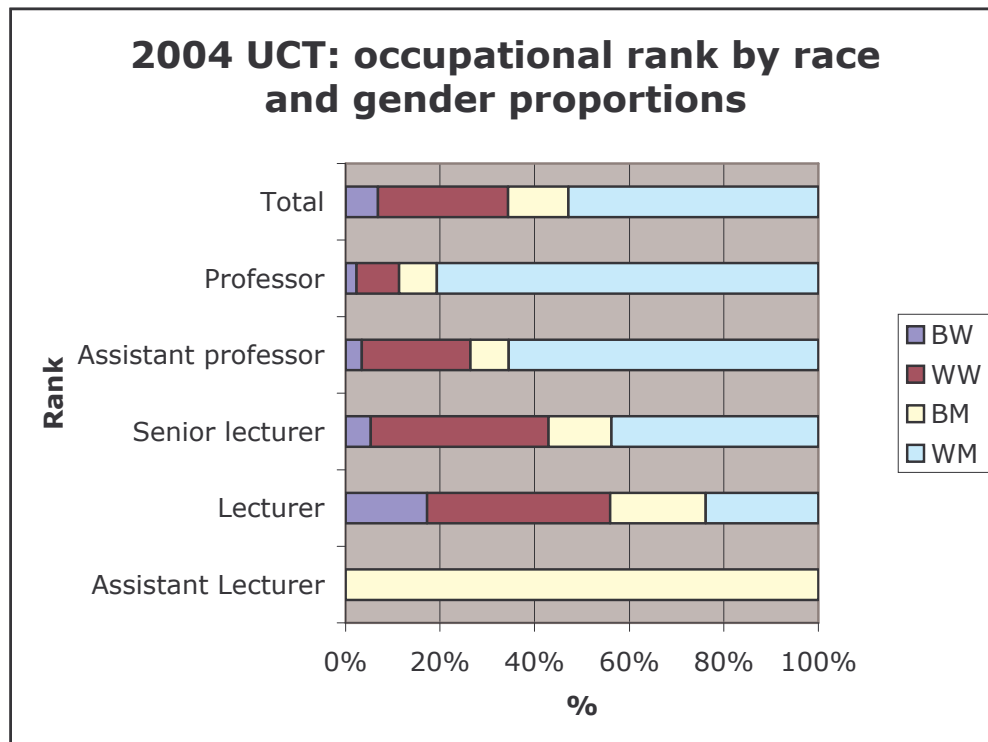
